

Happy Dogs

Keep your dog cool and happy at Medieval Fair:

1. Freeze water in soda bottles, wrap in a sock or towel and let the dog lie on them
2. Wrap ice bags in towels and tie around dogs neck
3. Provide shade for dog
4. Provide lots of water for dog-water paws has water
5. Stop and wipe dog with wet towel often: ears, around neck, tummy, groin, paws
6. If its very hot, wet the dog down often

If your dog shows any of these signs, get you dog to the Water Paws booth immediately or send for Sena at Water Paws by the Unicorn Stage. Water Paws has a dog cooling station and water for dogs, cats, ferrets, rodents and other pets and a First Aid Kit for pets.

1. Rapid breathing or struggling to breathe
2. Excessively heavy breathing and panting
3. **Suddenly stops panting-Emergency!**
4. Loud, irregular panting
5. Dark red gums
6. Excessive drooling or foaming at the mouth
7. Vomiting and or diarrhea
8. **Stumbling, trouble walking-Emergency!**
9. Listless, vacant stare, glazed eyes
10. **Dry mouth and nose-Emergency!**
11. **Shaking or seizures- Emergency!**
12. **Collapse or unconsciousness-Emergency!**

Once Water Paws gets your heat-stressed dog stabilized, you MUST get it to a vet ASAP for IV fluids and electrolytes.
