



Attention Performers!

The 2021 Medieval Fair Virtual Extravaganza will be April 9, 10 & 11.

Please note:

The Medieval Fair is a *medieval* festival and not a renaissance festival. The flavor is as different as chocolate is to vanilla. The year is 1360 in Avalon England near Glastonbury Abbey and King Edward III has just signed a peace treaty with France. The Entertainment Jury is focused on selecting quality acts that best fit our theme as well as our mission statement “To ignite the spark of curiosity that leads to lifelong learning through educational entertainment.” The Medieval Fair is a program of the University of Oklahoma Outreach. **All performances and content should be appropriate for general audiences, i.e. Rated G.**

New for 2021 Regarding Payment:

To comply with State of Oklahoma and University of Oklahoma requirements, performers must agree to be paid via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). Performers will receive instructions on how to fill out the Financial Registration on the State of Oklahoma’s Secure Online Vendor Registration Portal and complete the Vendor EFT Enrollment Request Form to submit to Performer’s bank. Paper checks will no longer be available to hand out after last performance on Sunday. At this time, we don’t have details on the timing of the EFT payment in relation to completion of performance but will update you as we learn more regarding the new system.

Performer Proposal Requirements

Virtual entertainment for the 45th Medieval Fair will be selected by jury. Please submit the following items by February 1st, 2021 to be considered. All performers must submit proposals, even those that have performed in the past. Proposals must be submitted online at mis.medievalfair.org. You will need to have the following information ready to submit your application.

1. **Short** Biography.
2. Short Description of performance – BE CREATIVE. Do you want to do something prerecorded or live? Do you have ideas for being interactive? Do you have tip jar or a sales site for your CD’s? What is your preferred platform – zoom, FB live, YouTube, etc.?
3. Video (preferred) or audio recording of your talent. A web link is acceptable.
4. Any special requirements for your performance?
5. Preferred stage or area. For 2021 select “2021 Virtual” on the application form.
6. Preferred show times and/or any restrictions on when you are available to perform, such as “not available on Friday”.
7. List of other Medieval or Renaissance Festivals at which you have performed and the years performed there.
8. Photos of you/your group preferably in your medieval costume.
9. Compensation, if any, required for your performance. (Please remember that The Medieval Fair is a free admission fair with a very limited budget. Tip Jars, venmo requests, CD sales, etc. are allowed and encouraged for all.)
10. Legal names and home city and state of all members of your group (not stage names). (This can be changed up to two weeks before fair. I just have to verify that nobody is on any sexual or violent offender registries as per University requirements.)
